

2010-2011 Fact Sheet Physical Therapist Education Programs

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



Distribution of Accredited and Developing PT Programs (including non-US programs) By Geographical Region 2004-2011 [as of 7/12/2011; n=229]
























Sex of PT Faculty AY 2009-10




Age of Core Faculty







Entry-level Degrees Held by Core Faculty 2010-2011




Highest Degree Held by Core Faculty 2010-2011






Highest Academic Degree Held by FT Core Faculty (2005 – 2010)
