*	Projections are good faith estimates for planning purposes. Tuition and fees are subject to change without notice. As a public institution, tuition levels are significantly affected by federal and state funding. The School of Dentistry's academic calendar (summer/fall/spring) varies from the University's financial aid calendar (fall/spring/summer). The first year of dental school does not include a summer semester. Students advance to the next academic year after spring semester. Be aware that financial aid is awarded each summer according to the University's financial aid calendar, meaning that D2 Summer aid will be offered in the same aid year as the D1 Fall & Spring aid, etc.
^	International students in the 4-year DDS program pay the non-resident rate, and are assessed two additional fees each semester by International Student and Scholar Services (ISSS): <i>International Student Aid/Engagement Fee</i> (\$8 Summer 2017; \$14 each F/Sp) and the <i>International Student Support Services Fee</i> (\$70 Summer 2017; \$165 each F/Sp). <i>At the time of publication, the Regent's approved fees were not yet published for the 2020-2021 year.</i> International students in the Program for Advanced Standing Students (PASS) have a different tuition structure; consult the PASS office for more information.
+	Academic Records Fee: New Fall 2019. One time fee assessed to support the development and maintenance of the academic record including official document production. \$150 for new students; \$75 for continuing students and non-degree seeking students.
1	Textbooks & General Supplies: The amount of aid offered for textbooks and general supplies is a set amount of \$1,000 per semester. Actual needs may vary by course and semester; amounts listed above include only required textbooks, if purchased at full price from the University Bookstore. Students may check the course syllabus for textbook information. DDS4 students will not be required to purchase any new textbooks. This estimated cost of \$1,000 is intended to help cover the cost of board exams.
2	Living Expenses: The amounts shown for Room and Board, Transportation, and Personal/Miscellaneous expenses are estimates based on the University's surveys of housing (one-bedroom apartments) in the University area and on government statistics for weekly food consumption, transportation, and personal/miscellaneous expenses. You are not required to accept the full amount of the loan offered to you. It is recommended that you borrow only what is needed for your unique situation, in consideration of any other funding sources and variations in individual living expenses. If students accept too much aid, it is possible to return aid in the same semester by contacting the Office of Student Finance.
3	Loan Fees: This amount is offered in financial aid packages to offset the cost of loan origination fees. Actual loan fees depend on the loan type and amount of aid accepted.
4	Health Insurance Requirement: Students are required to have health insurance coverage, and may submit a Cost of Attendance Appeal to include the cost of health insurance in their financial aid assessment. Students may elect to purchase the University's Student Health Benefit Plan (SHBP) or private insurance. The 2020-2021 rate for SHBP single student coverage is \$1,272 for each semester in Fall and Spring; Summer is included if the student was enrolled in the SHBP the previous spring.
