Seeking OBGYN residents for interview study about IUD education and communication

STUDY INFORMATION: Volunteers are being sought to participate in a study on education and communication surrounding intrauterine devices (IUDs). The aim of the study is to understand how physicians are educated about IUDs and how, in turn, they counsel patients. Questions will center on medical practice and education surrounding contraception, with a particular focus on IUDs. Residents will be asked about their beliefs and opinions regarding various forms of contraception, as well as their experiences with contraception counseling and education.

HOW WILL INTERVIEWS BE CONDUCTED? Participants will be interviewed via phone or telecommunication (e.g., Zoom) for approximately **60-90 minutes**.

PRIVACY INFORMATION: Interviews will be video- or audio-recorded. Participants identity will remain confidential. Any reports published based on this research will not include respondents' names or other identifying information. All audio recordings will be deleted after they are transcribed. Video recordings will be deleted immediately after the interview. Anonymized transcriptions of recordings will be stored in an encrypted folder on a password protected device. Participants may refuse to answer any questions you do not wish to answer or withdraw from the study at any point.
