

3. Readiness Requirements Complete any 3 of the following.			<i>(Updated- OCT 2012)</i>
a. Demonstrate proficiency in set-up & use of a field dentistry unit and radiographic equipment, or provide evidence of treating patients within the past 2 years using field dental equipment during an FTX or deployment.			
b. Participate in a dental humanitarian assistance mission. May be accomplished in federal (ie., Army Honduras mission, USN Comfort, etc.) or non-federal (NGO short term volunteer, ADA's Give Kids a Smile program, etc.) capacity.			
c. Complete the Combat Lifesavers Course. Usually available at local installations.			
d. Participate in a CBRNE or mass casualty simulation exercise, or participate in a forensic dental identification (with either a military or local civilian team).			
e. Earn the Expert Field Medical Badge			
f. Complete the CBRNE Emergency Preparedness Response Course (EPRC) for Clinicians (Course #J3O P-US258), on-line training at the Joint Knowledge Online website: http://jko.jten.mil/ [Enter JKO website through AKO and scroll to CBRNE Course number]			
g. Complete the USPHS-Indian Health Service Forensics Course or other similar forensics dentistry training. Course must be at least 8 hours duration.			
h. Complete the Medical Management of Chemical and Biological Casualties Course or other similar training conducted by the US Army Medical Research Institute of Chemical Defense (USAMRICD) and the US Army Medical Research Institute of Infectious Diseases (USAMRIID).			
4. Professional Development Requirements Complete 4a, and any 2 requirements from 4b, 4c, 4d, or 4e.			
a. Complete 50 hours of continuing dental education following graduation from the AEGD 12-month Program. At least 20 hours must be applicable to oral surgery and 20 hours applicable to endodontics. Credits used to satisfy item 4.b. are not applicable to this requirement.			
b. Complete at least 5 credit hours of distance learning modules offered by The Joint Medical Executive Skills Institute (JMESI) Program at https://jmesi.army.mil JMESI certificates or ATRRS records should be used to validate course completion			
c. Provide a clinical dentistry or military professional development table clinic or presentation to peers. The same presentation cannot be used to satisfy requirements 1.e. or 2.d. above.			
d. Publish an article with application to clinical or military dentistry in a periodic publication that is approved by your local commander.			
e. Serve at least 12 months in a leadership position for your DENTAC or dental treatment facility, e.g., Dental Company Commander, OIC, Infection Control Officer, HAZCOM Officer, Radiation Protection Officer, Patient Safety Officer, Junior Officer Council Representative, etc.
